Label your Child's Outerwear!

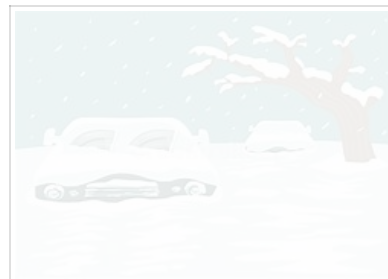

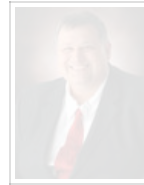
