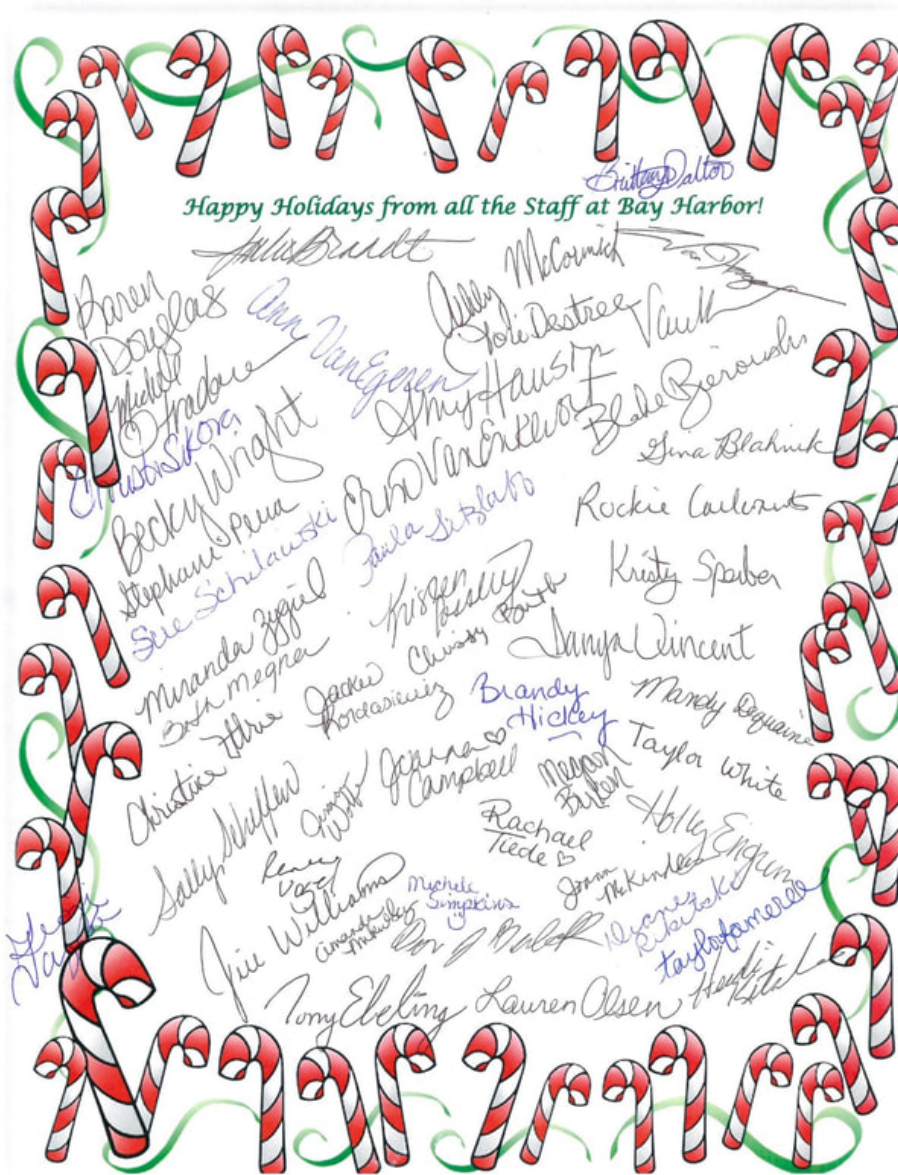

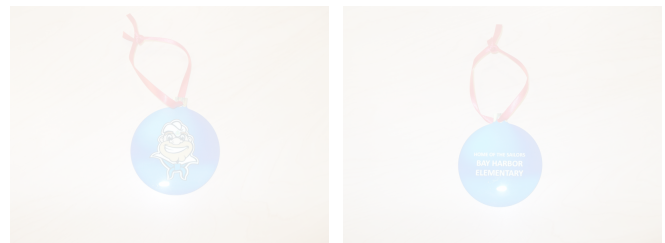


Parents/Guardians/Grandparents welcome to eat lunch at school!

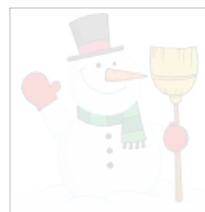

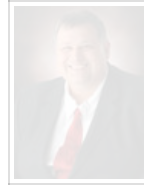
