Although students can benefit from using screens for educational purposes, sometimes family dynamics are adversely affected by an over abundance of recreational screen time. To this end, the **Campaign for a Commercial-Free Childhood** sponsors a **Screen-Free Week** each year. This year's event is being held from May 4-10. The following are tips from them to help your family reduce the amount of time spent in front of a screen.

- Turn off electronic devices during meals. Use this time to engage in family conversations.
- Keep electronics out of bedrooms. This will help improve sleep.
- Limit the amount of recreational screen time to less than two hours each day.
- Choose certain days or times of the day to be screen free.
- Designate technology free areas of your home.
