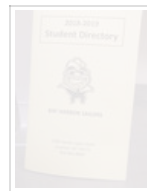
The Giving Tree is excited to announce that tickets are on sale now for the Scanlan Jewelers Necklace raffle.

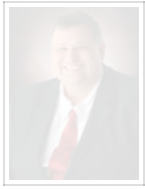
