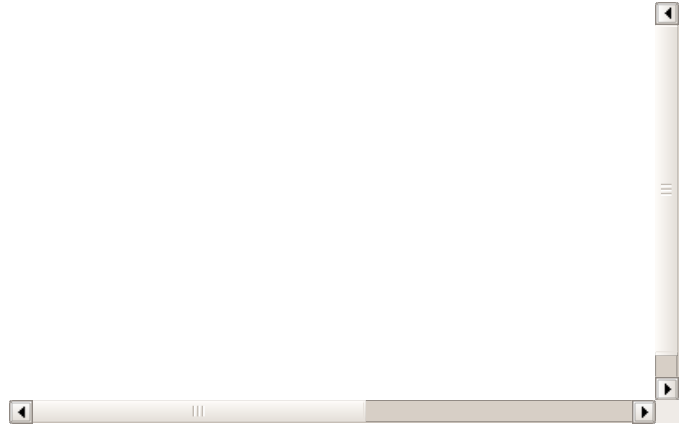

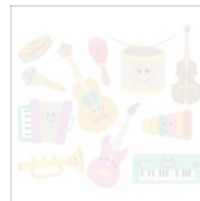
The Giving Tree is excited to announce that tickets are on sale now for the Scanlan Jewelers Necklace raffle.

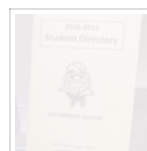

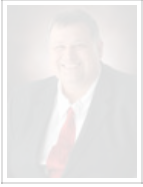

Our students continue to perform academically at a high level. Whether measured against our local districts, the state of Wisconsin or other countries, our students distinguish themselves on a regular basis.
