SAFE SUMMER TIPS



Summer months bring longer days, more opportunities to be outside and vacations. This leads to changes in routines, which is a risk factor for suffering an unintentional injury. According to Safe Kids Worldwide, the rate of unintentional injury escalates during the summer months. Keeping kids safe during summer months can be challenging. However, following these 5 tips could improve your chances of an injury-free summer.

1. Each year many children are serious injured by lawn mowers. Power lawn mowers have proved to be the most dangerous. [Learn more.](#)
2. Drowning is the second leading cause of injury-related death for children ages 1 to 4. Incidents of drowning increase during summer months. [Learn more.](#)
3. Allowing children to play with fireworks is dangerous. Sparklers can burn at 2,000 degrees, which is as hot as a blowtorch. [Learn more.](#)
4. More than 320 children die each summer due to heat stroke from being left in hot cars. Most of these children are younger than age 3. [Learn more.](#)

The **Parents' Guide to Student Success** <http://www.openstreetsgreenbay.com> was developed by the National PTA in response to the **Common Core State Standards** in English language arts and mathematics. Created by teachers, parents, education experts, and others from across the country, the standards provide clear, consistent expectations for what students should be learning at each grade in order to be prepared for college and career. National PTA® created the guides for grades K-8 and two for grades 9-12 (one for English language arts/literacy and one for mathematics). The *Guide* includes:

- Key items that children should be learning in English language arts and mathematics in each grade, once the standards are fully implemented.
- Activities that parents can do at home to support their child's learning.
- Methods for helping parents build stronger relationships with their child's teacher.

2013-2014 Class Assignments will be mailed to your home by the third week in August. Please notify the school office at 662-8800 if your address has changed since the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year to ensure you receive your child's placement.

Lost and Found items

Please check out the "Lost and Found" area before the school year is out if you think your child may have lost something at school. All unclaimed items will be donated.

Report cards will be sent home with students on the **last day of school** rather than being mailed a week later. Please check your students backpack on the last day of school for their report card.

Medication at School - end of school year

If your child currently has medication at school (prescription over-the-counter, cough drops, epi pen, inhaler, etc), it will need to be picked up on the last day of school. If this is not possible, please call the office to let us know when you would be able to pick it up. Any medication that would still be on hand at school by the end of June will be disposed of.

Memory Books

If you ordered a Memory Book for your child, they will be sent home on the last day of school in order for them to be signed by classmates which will take place on the last day of school.

We do have a few extra for purchase at a cost of \$13.50 if you would like to buy one now. They will be sold on a first come, first served basis. Please contact the office if you would like to purchase one.

School Kidz School Supply Kits

If you ordered a "School Kidz" School Supply Kit for 13-14, they will be delivered to Bay Harbor on August 20th. After that date you will be able to pick them up at school. There will be a reminder about this in the Class Placement letter that will sent home in mid August.

Hello Parents and Families!!

As the end of the approaches, I'd like to share our Life Skills news with you. Our students have recently learned about how to keep their bodies safe and healthy. They have also learned about healthy communication, Big Voice, friendship, and personal safety in recent weeks. The kids enjoy learning about ways to stand up to bullying behaviors! We practiced using assertiveness and how to respectfully stand up for themselves and others using their "Big Voice": "I don't like that, please STOP!"

Life Skills incorporates many useful lessons for social functioning. Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Programs I have utilized throughout the last 5 years at Bah Harbor including: Winner's Social Thinking, Dr. Bailey's Conscious Discipline, and Gibbs' TRIBES, help students to adjust to their surroundings and be efficient learners. The Center for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning or C.A.S.E.L has found that these programs:

Improve students' social-emotional skills, attitudes about self and others, connection to school, and positive social behavior; and reduce conduct problems and emotional distress.

- **Improve students' achievement test scores by 11 to 17 percentile points.**

Ultimately, Social Thinking, Conscious Discipline, and TRIBES, which many Bay Harbor teachers incorporate in their teaching, are helping our students to achieve more and feel better about themselves and others while learning.

As summer is right around the bend, please keep in mind the following tips:

- Eat healthy, nutritious meals together as a family (fruits and veggies)
- Exercise with your children—30 minutes daily, 5 times per week
- Kids and Parents: Always wear a bicycle helmet (even on your scooter!)
- Kids: Always ask first and then discuss with your parents know **where** you are going, **when** you'll return and **who** you are with (3 W's)
