Cathedral Pines Archeological Exploration and Old-growth Hike

Cathedral Pines not only features one of the finest old-growth pine-hemlock stands left in the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest, but is also the location of a Native American village and mound site that was occupied between the 12th and 15th centuries A.D. We will spend several hours exploring the beauty and ecology of the old-growth as well as delving into the mysteries and revelations found through recent archaeological investigations.



Archaeologist Mark Bruhy will guide our walk into the past in this highly sensitive area, and naturalist Libby Dorn will pilot our thoughts on the ecology of old-growth forests.

Please bring a bag lunch with beverage, as well as dress for the weather. Hiking will take place in hilly and uneven terrain. Families are welcome. This trip is not advisable for very young children.
