## **School Vision Screening Program**

(The screening program that the Health Department performs does not replace an eye examination by an optometrist or opthamologist)

Eligible Students: 4K, 5K, 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders, and teacher/parent referrals in non-targeted

grades.

First Screening: Trained staff will screen students using an eye screening chart and Random Dot

E (Stereopsis) Kit. If you child has glasses, they will be screened with glasses on

Second Screening: Brown County Health Department RN will re-screen students on the same day

who do not pass the first screening

**Equipment Used:** Goodlite Lighted Eye Chart and Random Dot E (Stereopsis) kit

**Referral Notices:** Brown County Public Health will notify parents/guardians if further evaluation is

recommended



## **School Hearing Screening Program**

**Eligible Students:** 4K, 5K, 1<sup>st</sup> graders, and teacher/parent referrals in non-targeted grades.

First Screening: Trained staff will screen students using an audiometer at 1000Hz, 2000Hz, and

4000Hz frequencies. Students must hear two of three tones at 20db for 1000Hz

& 2000Hz and 25db at 4000Hz.

Second Screening: Brown County Health Department (RN's) will re-screen students who do not

pass the first screening in 4-6 weeks to allow time for acute conditions to clear.

If they do not pass the 2<sup>nd</sup> screening an otoscopic examination may be

performed.

**Equipment Used:** Audiometer and Otoscope regularly, and OAE (Oto-Acoustic Emission) in hard to

screen children
