

Dear 3rd and 4th Grade Students and Parents:

For the third year, our school will participate in a Reading Olympics. Initially we will practice together from 8:00-8:30 on Wednesday mornings beginning in January 2013. After discussing all of the books, we will hold two book challenges. At that time, we will divide into teams. Each team will be asked questions about the books and can answer as a group.

The list of books that you will need to read is included on the back of this letter. You need to read all eight of the books to qualify for a team. Upon completing each book, you will need to fill out a page in your Reading Olympics Journal.

We will officially begin our Reading Olympics book discussions on January 9th, 2013. If you would like to participate, please fill out and return the participation agreement to school by Friday, December 7th. You will receive a calendar and your Reading Olympics Journal at a later date. The journal will help you log your reading and assist you in recalling the details of all the books that you read when it comes time for our discussions. This will be a good study guide to assist you in preparing for the book challenges we will have in March 2013.

All students who participate in this event by reading the books, filling out the journal, attending the Wednesday morning discussions and competing in at least one challenge will be entitled to attend the reading celebration at the end of the program.

We are very excited about this program. Please consider participating. The books on the attached list are available in our school library as well as the public library however you may also have to find copies from a friend, Amazon, etc. Books in the school library are on a first come, first serve basis.
