

Where did it start?

Duck Creek Pop Warner Football was started by Steve Hebel, Becky Hebel, Sheileen Cormier and Lynn Ricket.

The first season was in mid-January in 1999. They thought of the idea when they were out one night, celebrating Sheileen's Birthday.

Duck Creek Pop Warner Football was started because it was rewarding seeing younger kids learning the techniques of the game and safety of football. It was also started to Teach kids the importance of sportsmanship, fair play, and teamwork.

Duck Creek Pop Warner Football provides each player with football pants, a game jersey, a helmet with face mask and chin strap, shoulder, thigh, knee, hip and tail pads.

Each player must provide their own football cleats, socks, and mouth guard that attaches to their helmet. At the end of the season the equipment that Duck Creek Pop Warner Football provides, is turned back in to the organization and inspected for use for the next year.

You can play Duck Creek Pop Warner Football if you live in Howard, Suamico, Seymour, Pulaski, Oconto, Oconto Falls, Krakow, Little Suamico, Abrams, Sobieski, Sampson, Anston, Kunesh, Hobart, Oneida, and Pittsfield.

About us.....

When is the registration period?

- **March 1st thru June 1st**
- **On line registration can be accessed at duckcreekpopwarner.net**
- **How do I know that my son or daughter is registered?**
- After your registration is received it is entered into our system. The week after the end of registration we mail out welcome letters to all registered players/parents.
- We do not cash the equipment deposit check unless equipment is not returned at the end of the year. When equipment is returned you will receive your uncashed check back along with all items in your file. We do not retain personnel information from year to year.

What times are practices and games?

- For the first two weeks of practice the players will be required to practice 4 days per week. Monday thru Thursday, this is to get in our mandatory 10 hrs of non contact practices and 10 hrs of contact practices before we can play games. When school starts we switch to only Tuesday and Thursday practice.
- Games are Saturday mornings from 8:00am until 2:00pm. Games last 1.5 hrs roughly and will be scheduled inside that time frame and will differ from one week to another.

If my child misses practices due to vacations, sickness, or various reasons will his play time be effected?

- It can affect his play in a game or scrimmage if he has not completed the required 10 hrs of non-contact practice time and 10 hrs of contact practice time, which is required by Pop Warner.
- Each child is required to play a minimum of 10 snaps per game or more. This is a coach's decision based on the skills of a player and his/her safety on the field.

Where are practices and games?

- Practices for the two lower divisions (Jr Pee Wee and Pee Wee) are held at Calavera Spring Park. There is a map and directions on our website under "Park Locations".
- The upper division (Jr Midget) practice at Idle Wild Park. Directions are on our website under "Park Locations".
- All games are played at Idle Wild Park in Suamico

What equipment is needed by the player to play Pop Warner Football?

- The player is required to buy a mouth piece with an attachment to the helmet. The player is recommended to have football cleats; it is not required but highly recommended. Soccer cleats will work; the only difference is around the toe area. Cleats provide grip to the field and also allows a player to push off without slipping.
- All other equipment is provided by DCPW. Helmet, Shoulder Pads, Pants with Pads

Can I register a player that is not in our registration area?

- Yes, if the other local Pop Warner or youth football organizations are full.
- A player can not be in two leagues at the same time.

Duck Creek Pop Warner was a pilot program for USA Football's Heads Up Football program.

In 2013 the Green Bay Packers nominated Duck Creek Pop Warner to participate in a new pilot program being run by USA Football. The program called HUF or Heads Up Football, was started to teach all youth football players the proper way to tackle and play the game of football, with their heads up. One of our members went to a trainer seminar run by USA Football and learned all the techniques and teaching tools available. This information was brought back and shared with all of our coaches and parents. This new program has reduced the amount of injuries that have occurred in the game of football and made it safer for everyone involved. Duck Creek Pop Warner is a firm believer in this program and is actively teaching and using it in our program.
